the sky as blue. During sunset, because of the angle of the sun's rays, sunlight must pass through the atmosphere before reaching our eyes.

When the air is clear, the sunset will appear yellow, because the light from the sun has passed a long distance through air and the blue light has been scattered away. If the air is polluted with small particles, natural or otherwise, the sunset will be redder. Sunsets over the sea may also be orange, due to salt particles in the air. The sky around the sun is seen reddened, as well as the light coming directly from the sun. This is because all light is scattered relatively well through small angles, but blue light is then more likely to be scattered twice over the greater distances, leaving the yellow, red and orange colours. The longer wavelengths of red and orange light are not affected by the long path through the atmosphere and are still detected by our eyes. This is the reason (3)
