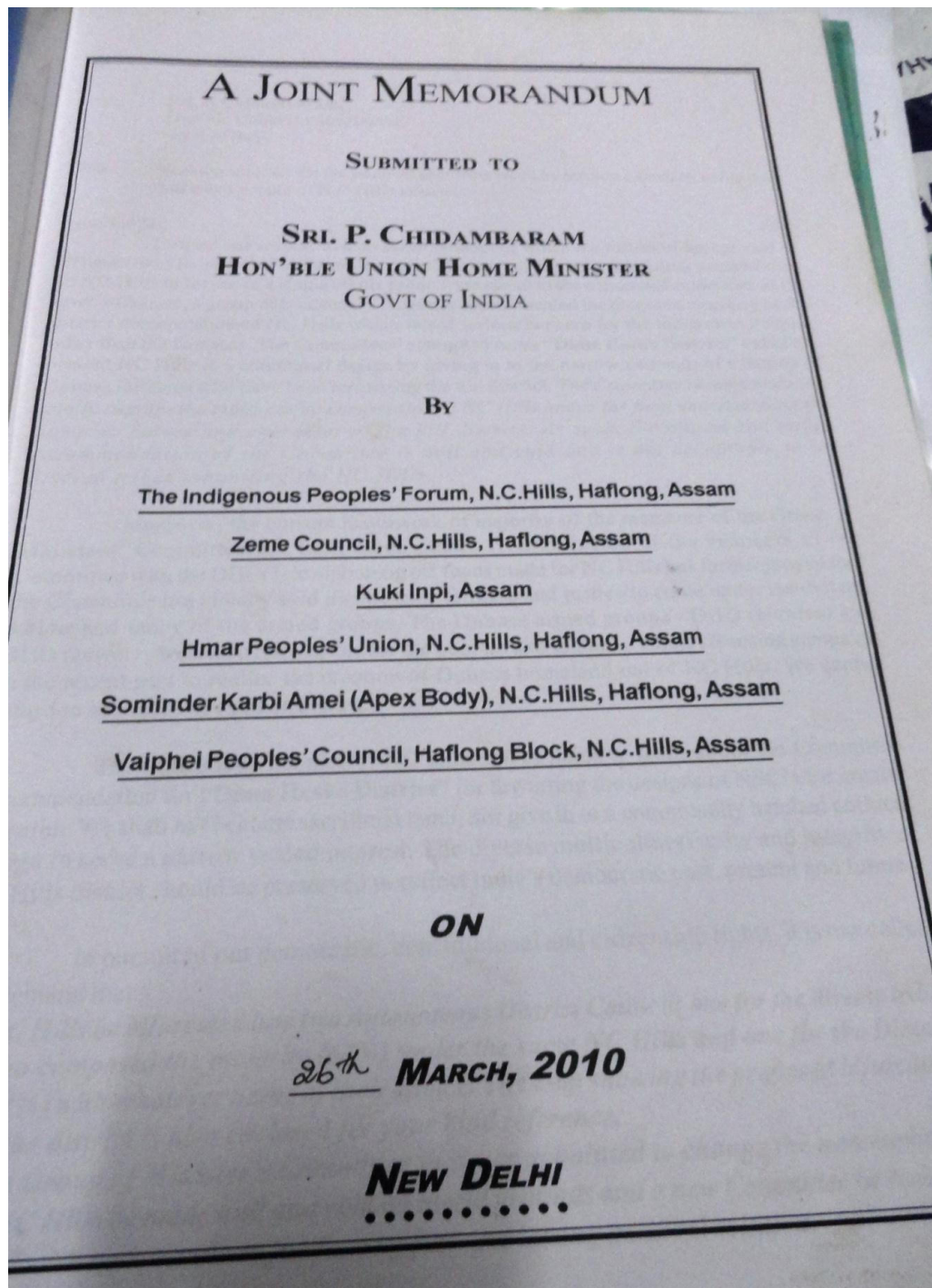

Hon'ble Sir,

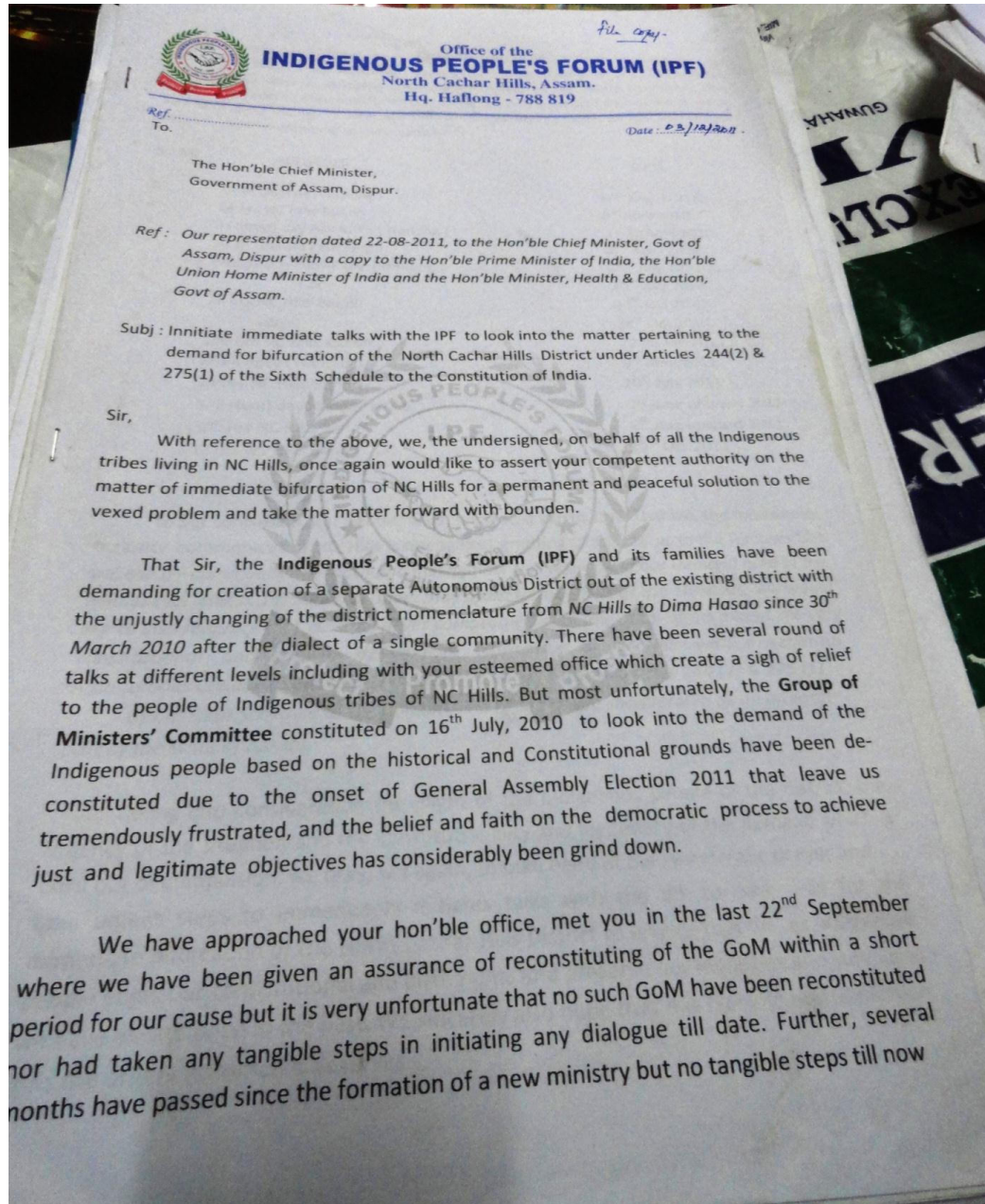

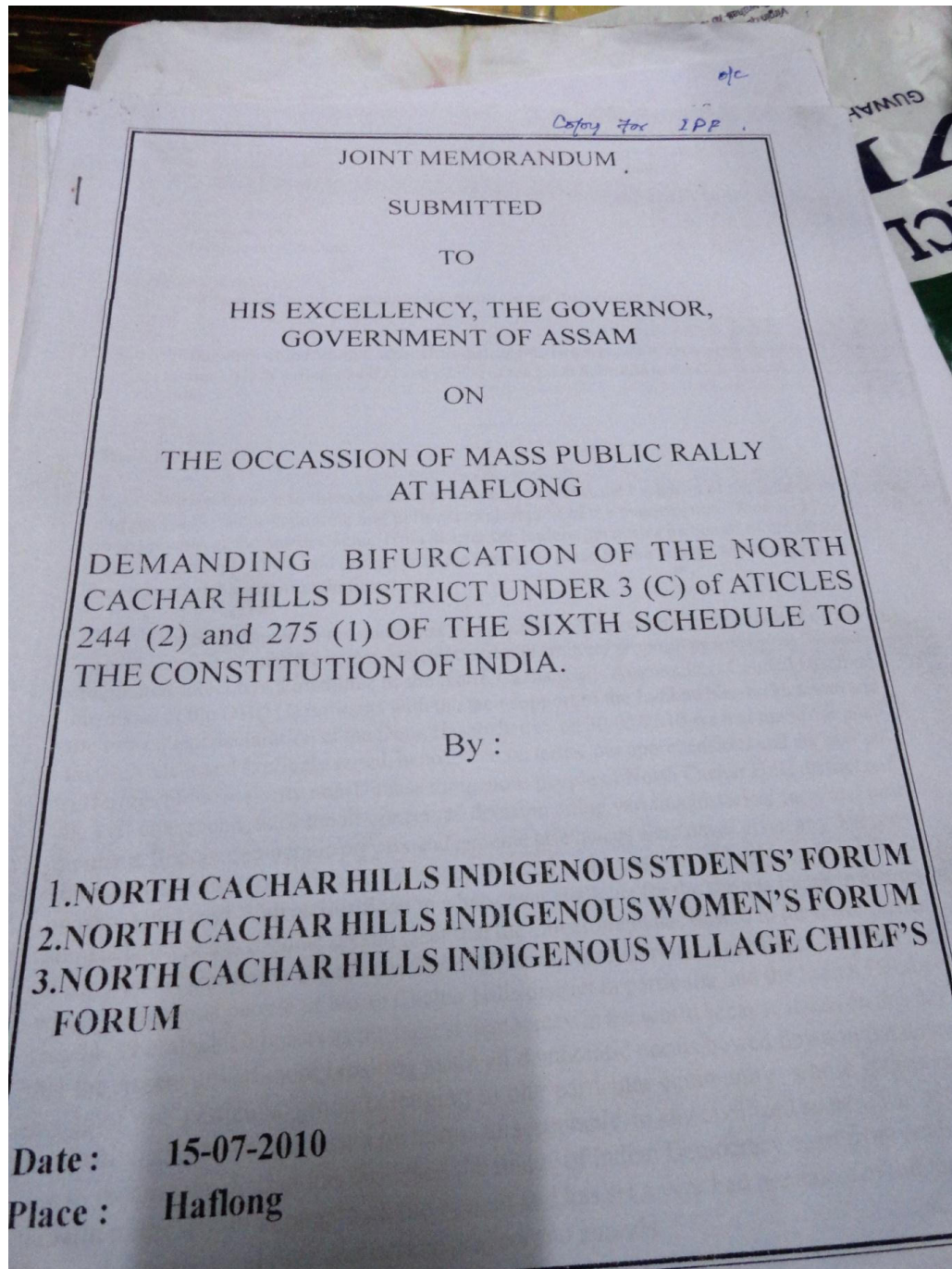
The **TASK FORCE**, in its report has clearly outlined – “ Having accepted the need for speeding up the development in the hill areas, the Task Force felt that the demand for setting up two separate, independent autonomous District Councils should be considered by the govt as a measure to solve the development issues faced by the Dimasa and non-Dimasa groups of people in the district. The Task Force also felt that once the development issues are allowed to be handled effectively by each of these Councils, the respective group may not have any difficulty if the district is not further bifurcated or administrative reorganization is not carried out as demanded by the non Dimasa tribal groups “.
