





***Ratha* Plans of the Temples**


**a. Square**




**b. *Triratha***



**c. *Pancharatha***







***Chala-Type Roofs***


**a. Assam hut type**




**b. Bengal hut type**


**Maghnowa Do'l, Lakhimpur**




