PREFACE

The research work 'A Study of the Evolution of Soma in Vedic Mythology and Ritual' has been undertaken to ascertain the evolution of an earthly plant, later personified as a divinity and heavenly being and called king and made sovereign in the field of Vedic mythology and ritual.

The text of the Vedic *Samhitās*, the *Brāhmaṇas* and the *Śrauta Sūtras* and other reference books have been studied for formulating the thesis. Data has been collected from primary and secondary sources. Journals, seminar proceedings and internet has been consulted. This research work has been prepared with the best possible sincerity.

The proposed research work is divided into five chapters. The first chapter provides an introduction to the present work with a discussion on Vedic Gods, association of Soma with other Gods, Vedic rituals and the ninth maṇḍala of the Rgveda. The second chapter deals with characteristics of the Soma and his medicinal power. The third chapter deals with rituals of Somayāga and inter relation of Somayāga with other yāgas. The fourth chapter deals with a study on the synchronization of rituals and myths of the God Soma and the fifth chapter resumes to its major findings and provides for the concluding observations of the proposed research work.

The God Soma is one of the prominent Deities of the Veda. Soma in creeper form is crushed for procuring its juice for its useful role in the ritual. The Soma drink was considered the most effective of all medicinal preparations. Soma being regarded as a divine drink which bestows immortal life. Soma is the soul of sacrifice. As the ritual plays a very important role in *Rgveda* it is only natural that Soma, the plant, the juice of which is so much used in the ritual is deified as one of the most important of Vedic God Soma. Soma, the Vedic God or Soma ritual is the
